

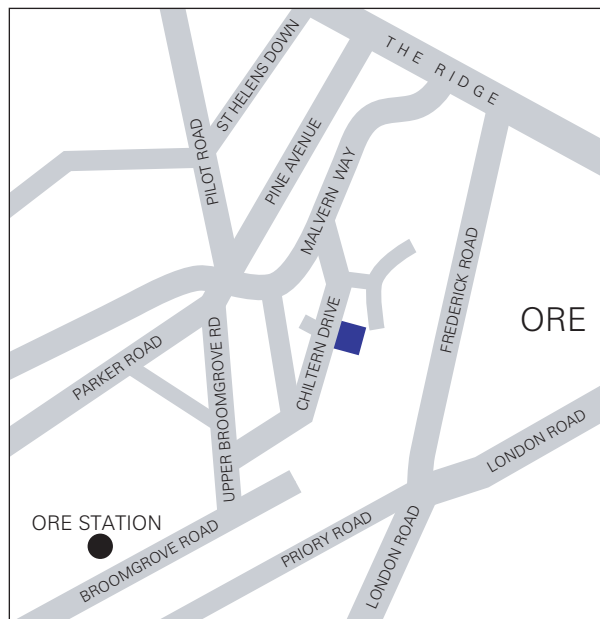

## Who are we?

OASIS is a community-based project managed by a steering group of local residents. Jackie Gaunt is the co-ordinator.

Jackie co-ordinates the general running of the OASIS centre, and the older people's drop-in on Tuesday mornings 10-12am at C.J.'s Malvern Way.

## Our history

In a 1995 health survey for the Ore Valley Forum local residents asked for a health advice centre. After a lot of hard work the centre was created in an empty flat above the parade of shops in Malvern Way. Local residents decided on the name Oasis (Ore Advice Support Information Service). Since then Oasis has moved and expanded finally taking up residence in the new Sure Start Centre. It shares the building with a range of agencies and works with them to provide services to the local community. Sussex University now has access to a training suite for its Centre for Continuing Education (CCE) courses, a baby clinic will be run from the health visitor's rooms and crèche will be available in the new purpose-built facility on the ground floor.

All services are freely available to everybody in the Ore Valley.

## What are we?

We are a local centre for local people with rooms for community use and on-site facilities and resources. All our services are free and entirely confidential.

The Centre is fully accessible with a slope at the entrance, a lift to all floors, a disabled toilet and wheelchair access to the information library and meeting room.
