#### Trust.....Projects

Current projects at the Trust are:

Community Enablers— funded by the Big Lottery Reaching Communities fund to support community activity and develop employability by providing supported volunteering and work placements to community groups and small businesses.

Neighbourhood Enablers—funded by the Social Action Fund to increase volunteering across Hastings, Bexhill, Rye and rural Rother, providing funds and support for street level volunteering activities which provide a real community benefit.

Trust Loans—our affordable loans scheme for those who are excluded from mainstream banking, helping local residents to better manage their finances.

EcoFab and Pathway to Construction—projects both relating to careers in the Built Environment, EcoFab offers a cross channel

knowledge exchange programme funded through Interreg Channel. Pathway to Construction is a contractor led initiative raising awareness of careers in the Built Environment working with schools culminating in an annual showcase event in Alexandra Park.

Community asset ownership is a great way of enabling third sector, social enterprises and ethical enterprises to access affordable office and workshop space to enable them to deliver their services and products.

The Hastings Trust owns and manages office, workshop and other commercial premises across Hastings and St Leonards at an affordable rent of £7.50 per square foot (negotiable) and can offer 'easy in, easy out' licence terms.

Third sector organisations, social enterprises and ethical enterprises can also make use of our 'virtual office' facility where for a small fee of £20 per month we provide a postal address, mail collection service, and access to our conference room free of charge (by arrangement) for meetings with clients and other stakeholders. Our meeting room is also available for hire at affordable rates.

At our Braybrooke Terrace premises we have a fully accessible and fully equipped IT training facility available for private hire at competitive rates.

In addition to commercial property, The Hastings Trust also manages a small portfolio of residential accommodation. These apartments were refurbished as eco-flats as part of our Skills to Build project making best use of energy efficiency features to reduce heating and lighting costs and demonstrating that such technologies can even be applied to Victorian terraced properties.
