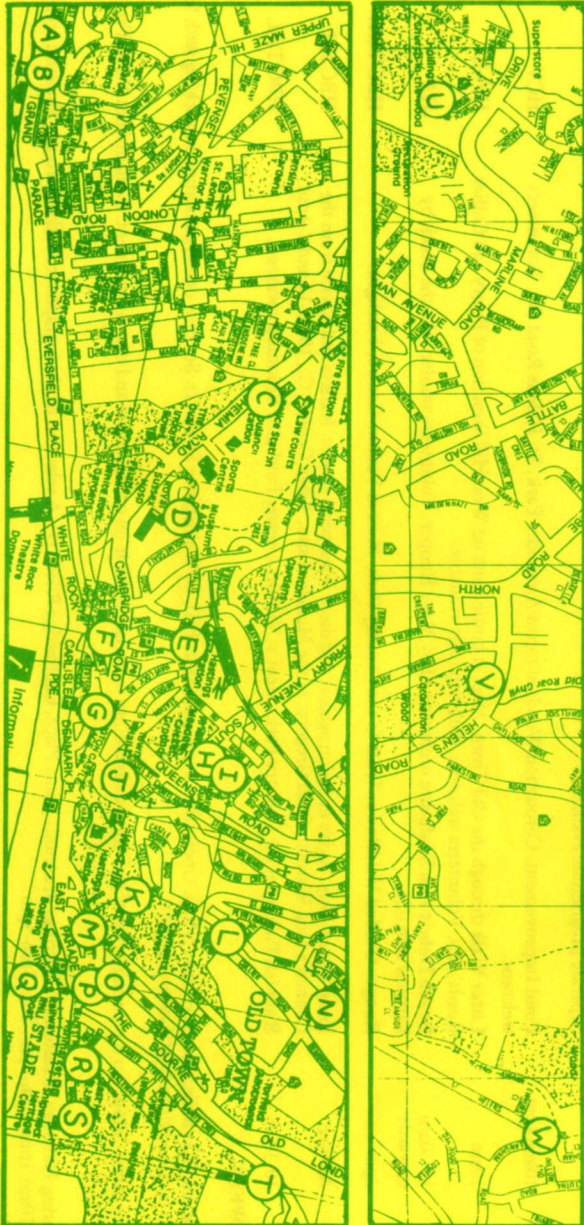


LOCATION MAP FOR EVENTS DURING ENVIRONMENT WEEK
