### THE CHALLENGE

Over the next few years major changes are planned to take place to regenerate the Ore Valley area, including:

- improvements to housing
- building a new access road
- the development of industrial land to create areas for business and employment
- the creation of a local park

These changes will have a major impact on the area and local people now have an opportunity to make their views known and help create a vision for the area in which they live.

### PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

The Action Planning Weekend will bring together all sections of the community and others with an interest in the area: residents, employers, local council representatives and officers, the Police, professionals and local voluntary organisations. It will be facilitated by a multidisciplinary team which will draw up a report during the weekend making recommendations for action.

The event will consist of a series of action planning workshops looking at all aspects of life in the Ore Valley. It will provide a chance for everyone to share their views and work together to identify the best ways of improving the quality of life in the area.

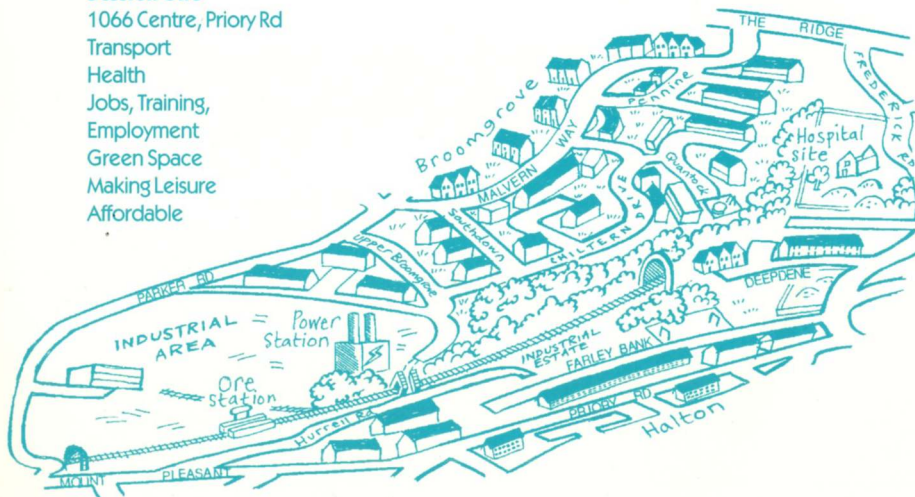
